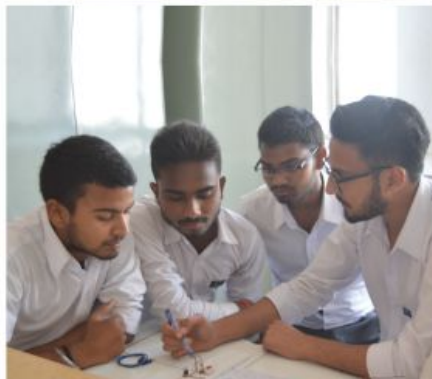


## Hands on workshop using Breadboard organized

## KEEMA MASALA

Sr.n	Ingredients	Qty
1.	Ground lamb/ minced lamb	1/2 kg
2.	Vegetable/canola/sunflower cooking oil	3 TBSP
3.	Cumin seeds	1 TSP
4.	Onions chopped fine	2 MD. SIZE
5.	Garlic paste	1 TBSP
6.	Ginger paste	1 TBSP
7.	Coriander powder	2 TBSP
8.	Cumin powder	1 TBSP
9.	Garam masala	1 TBSP
10.	Salt to taste	TO TASTE
11.	Tomatoes chopped fine	2 MD.-SIZE
12.	Juice of lime	1/2 A LIME
13.	Chopped coriander leaves to garnish	

## HOW TO MAKE....



1. Heat the cooking oil in a wok or deep pan, on medium heat.
2. Add the cumin seeds and fry for 1 minute. Add the onions now. Fry till they turn a pale golden colour.
3. Add the ginger and garlic pastes and fry for 1 minute.
4. Add the minced meat and all the powdered spices - coriander, cumin, garam masala and salt to taste.
5. Continue to brown the minced meat, stirring often to prevent burning. This should take about 5-7 minutes.
6. Add the tomatoes, stir and cook till they are soft.
7. Turn the fire off, add the lime juice and stir.
8. Garnish with chopped coriander leaves and serve with hot chapatis or parathas.

## UGC's order shows how pervasive plagiarism is!

The new rules approved by the University Grants Commission (UGC) say that researchers will lose their registration and teachers their jobs if found guilty of plagiarizing. There will be graded punishment for offenders. This essential move should have come much earlier to ensure that Indian academia is a wellspring of fresh ideas rather than a morass of regurgitated thoughts. Plagiarism — the practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own (read cheating) — has been gnawing away at India's academia for years; even top academicians have been caught at it. For example, Pondicherry University vice-chancellor Chandra Krishnamurthy quit in 2016 after a prolonged stand-off with the ministry of human resource development, following allegation that she plagiarized large parts of one of her books. Appa Rao Podile, Vice-Chancellor of the University of Hyderabad, was accused of plagiarizing from not one, but three scientific papers.

In India, plagiarism flourishes for several reasons. It is almost ingrained in the system, starting from school where students are not taught to think or check on sources, but learn by rote from whatever notes they get their hands on. Few schools go out of their way to inculcate in students the moral integrity that treats plagiarism as a serious, scornful offence. To many students (and teachers), the Internet is a vast reservoir of knowledge and information into which they can dip at will. There are two flawed assumptions about the Internet: that it is always free (and free to draw upon), always accurate; and that there is no need to attribute sources to stuff taken from it.

There is no real action against people indulging in the malpractice. Guidelines on research misconduct don't have any time frames for the closure of such cases. Institutions of higher education, which should push students to strive for originality, actually don't want to rock the boat and punish those who indulge in plagiarism. The new rules should change that.

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## The Role of Yoga in Education

Yoga provides a holistic approach to health and well being and these are very much related to education. In the era of stress and anger, mindfulness and meditation exercises are becoming increasingly popular. We looked at the role of yoga in education from various angles, including the type of education that was being provided to children throughout the world as well as the different levels of stress that children face in the classroom environment.

The difficulties, problems, conflicts, distractions and dissipation of their energies are also considered. We started using certain principles and practices of yoga firstly, an experiment to increase the children's learning ability and secondly to inspire teachers to teach their subjects in a slightly different way. Our beliefs, was and still, is that we are educating our children without considering or caring for the growth of their entire personality. We are cramming their brains and minds with information without creating any support group outside the classroom environment where they can continue Imbibe education. We have to look at what science says about the growth of a child, what

psychoanalysis says about child psychology and how the hormones and glands alter and influence the rationality, emotional stricture and creative output of the child.

The brain is the only medium through which we educate our

mind. The mind is a composition of four different faculties, which in yogic terminology are defined as Manas, Bhuddhi, Chiita and Ahamkara. The word Manas means to rationalize, to think about something, Bhuddhi means intellect. Chiita is an area of consciousness where impressions are stored. Ahamkara is the concept of ego. In the modern education system we are feeding only one aspect of the mind - Bhuddhi. We are not dealing with the Manas aspect, which deals with the

faculty to know what is right and what is wrong. We are not dealing with Chiita, where impressions of knowledge are stored in the form of memory and experience. Nor are we dealing with Ahamkara, the ego. Rather we are cramming Bhuddhi with information without boosting up the other aspects of our mind.

Therefore, despite all our education, we are not able to apply it constructively and creatively in our lives. The problem is not only with education system. The problem is also with parents. Proper education can only be received when parents allow children to use their intuitive abilities along with their intellectual abilities, when parents allow them to overcome their fears and inhibitions, to overcome the psychological pressures. Now, the system of educating children should be different. It has to be combined with certain practices which can remove their psychological blocks, which can make them aware of the psychological changes that happen in their body and brains, which can make them aware of their own distraction and which can give them the ability to focus in the theme of the subject they are studying.

## Drawing a fine line from expecting to believing

Did you ever ponder on the word 'Expectations'? Did you accept that you expect? If your statement is affirmative, CONGRATULATIONS. Expecting things has been embedded in our DNA, though we are taught not to ask for anything as it is written in our holy books, 'Demanding nothing will end up giving you everything' yet we reciprocate. Expectations have got variegated expression. The greatest mistake we humans make when expectations are not fulfilled is we listen half, understand quarter, think zero and react double. For us, not expecting things is being a fish out of water. Expectations grow from a seedling into a giant oak. Recall those days, when we used to pretend having a stomach ache, expecting our parents to say, 'A no for school' and now think of the time when we expect our loved ones to surprise us. How lovely!
