The Model Town streets from 6am to 9am were cordoned off for the citizens. They used the streets for recreation that promoted health, well being, fitness, togetherness and joy.

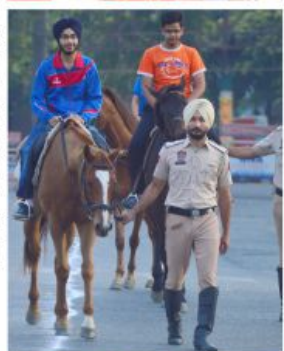

## "The Runway"

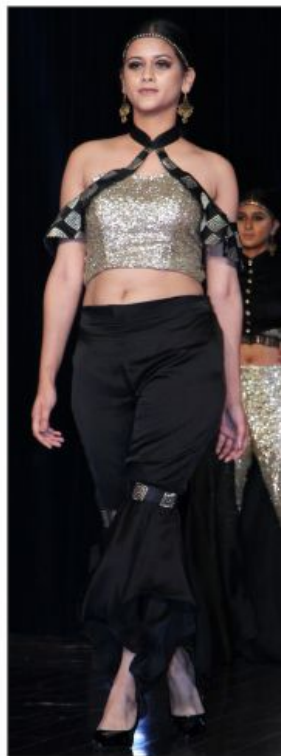

Sr.n	Ingredients	Qty
1.	Guava Juice	60ml
2.	Mint Leaves	5g
3.	Coriander Leaves	5g
4.	Lemon Wedges	3wedges
5.	Black Salt	5g
6.	Custard Sugar	5g
7.	Blue Curacao	4-5drops
8.	Sprite	60ml

## HOW TO MAKE....



First of all, take mint leaves, coriander leaves, lemon wedges, custard sugar, and black salt and then muddle them in shaker properly. Then, add Guava Juice into it and shake it well with ice and pour half of Pilsner with this juice. After this, in another shaker, take sprite, add 4-5 drops of Blue Curacao into it and stir it properly. Then, make a layer properly over the Guava juice. Your drink is ready to serve.

## An epitome of talent



Dr. Harprit Singh

It is believed that medicine is the serious profession. Doctors are considered to be studious enough. But, Dr. Harprit Singh has maintained a balance between his profession and personal life. Ask him how he distresses himself, he quips, "By music and running."! Yes, you read it correct. Talking about his personal life, Singh is very chilled out person who loves to work out in gym, who loves to sing. Not only this, Singh is a

good photographer as well as a professional guitarist. Singh is the man who personifies dedication, determination and distinction! Singh is Ms. Mch (ortho), Gold Medalist, a consultant joint replacement and Arthroscopic Surgeon who is successfully running 'Orthonova Hospital' – an only centre for Oxford Knee Replacement in India.

He has conducted 37,000 successful surgeries, marking a success to his professional journey. Singh's hard work and sincerity towards his profession brought him the laurels and appreciation in India and abroad, in a short period of time. He strongly believes in performing all the surgeries himself, so he never keeps a junior with him. The topmost achievement Singh has under his belt is the assurance of zero percent infection in primary surgeries.

There are quite less number of centers in the world which have attained this target. This is just due to the personalized strict sterilization policy of the hospital. There has

been no case of infection in the last one and a half year.

Another triumph is unbelievably short surgical time of 09 minutes for a knee replacement and 06 minutes for partial hip replacement making it possible for the patients with heart functions up to 25 percent also to opt for surgery albeit the risks. He introduced walk-in-one-day principle after knee replacements. Most of his patients can sit on the floor after replacement of the joints. Due to his intelligence and farsightedness, he is able to introduce the concept of Oxford knee replacement in India. He is a faculty and international instructor for Oxford knee replacement.

He has done maximum number of oxford knee replacements in Asia. He has done maximum number of metal to metal total hip replacements in North India. He commenced Proxima hip replacement in North India.

Orthonova hospital provides services to trauma and accident patients, has a dedicated team for joint replacements,



spine surgeries, arthroscopic management of knee and shoulder. Presently, this is the only centre in India offering this most advanced surgical option for knee replacement.

All the advanced surgical techniques in the field of orthopedics in North India originate from this centre. This is only because Singh keeps himself attached with various hospitals all over the globe and whatever new technology he finds would be useful for India, he gets it here to his centre. There has been a reversal trend of the patients opting for surgeries. Earlier, patients used to go to Delhi or Mumbai for joint replacements, but now people not only from Punjab, Chandigarh but also from Delhi, and even as far as Meghalaya and Mumbai visit this centre for the advanced surgeries. Patients from Canada, US, UK, Kenya, Hongkong also get their knees and hips operated at this centre. The specialty of the hospital is that it assures the satisfaction of the patients being treated here and Singh believes in the same fact only.

## Death punishment is not a solution

The government's response to the Kathua rape case has been on predictable lines – women and child development minister, Maneka Gandhi, wants the death penalty introduced into the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (Pocso) 2012 for those accused of raping a minor below the age of 12. Knee jerk reactions like this invariably follow heinous sexual crimes like the Kathua case in which an eight year old Bakerwal girl was abducted, raped and murdered by a number of people including serving policemen. But in most cases of child rape and molestation, the perpetrator is a person known to the child and, therefore, the child is unwilling or unable to name him.

The real problem is that we have very poor forensics. In a rape case, whether of a child or an adult, the evidence must be collected within 24 hours of the crime. This is often not done. The FIR should be filed as quickly as possible. The investigation must have a deadline. In the Kathua case, the filing of the charge sheet was thwarted by a few renegade lawyers, following which the case become highly politicised.

There is little evidence to suggest that the death penalty is an effective deterrent. In the Kathua case, it is clear that the offenders thought they could get away with it, thanks to police complicity.

Better prosecution, the certainty of conviction and the severity of the sentence will work far better. In the case of rapes of minors – there were 19,675 recorded in 2016 alone – there has to be a well-defined timeline to press charges. The longer the case is delayed, the more the chances of the accused being able to intimidate the victim and her family as happened in the Unnao case. The first step in securing convictions in child rape cases begins with improving the workings of the police station, the first port of call for the victim. There have been instances in which the police have refused to file FIRs, especially when the victims are from poor families. In the case of child victims, the police must be particularly sensitive and quick when recording complaints. This will be a better way to secure justice for child victims than focusing on the death penalty.
