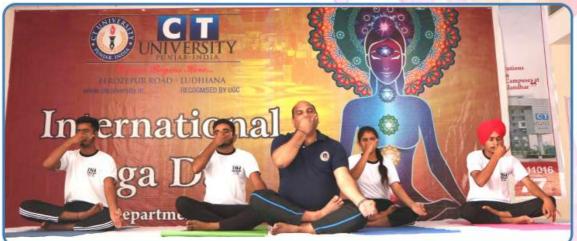
The key organizer Neete Raj Singh thanked all the participants for showing
