This year, CT Group will give new students a sapling along with their admission letters



For the coming academic year and in an attempt to encourage students to be eco-friendly, CT Group of Institutions, Shahpur and Maqsudan is gifting a sapling to the students taking admission and encouraging them to plant it by promoting the green cause.

This is a Group's decision taken at the managerial level and has been communicated to all institutes including agriculture, engineering, humanities and pharmacy etc. The institutes will provide one sapling to each

student and direct them to plant it either in the campus premises or around their residence. The notion has been accepted after countries like Philippines passed a new law that requires students to plant saplings during their academic year.

Dr. Jasdeep Kaur Dhama, Campus Director, Maqsudan said, "The new students taking admissions are encouraged to plant many benefiting plants such as Azadirachta indica (Neem), Melia azedarach (Darek), Cascabela thevetia (lucky nut) and others in our campus."

"The student will take care of the sapling and nurture it until he or she gets out of the college. In the end, the student will take a photograph with that plant and the Group will issue a certificate of appreciation to them. This process involves regular picture submission of a student with his plant. We are also implementing the same in CT Public School and CT World School where students will get grade marks by planting saplings during their academic year," explained Manbir Singh, Managing Director.

CTU to motivate students for planting and nurturing of trees to get grade marks

Under the new environment-oriented programme of CT University, the students especially the new admissions will be motivated to plant trees to obtain grade marks in the coming academic year. It has been proposed that at the time of admission, each student will give an undertaking, countersigned by his/her mentor/department head, that the student will plant at least 10 saplings and look after these to see them grow into healthy trees during their study period to get grade

marks. The students are also being motivated to bring from their native places some seeds/saplings of different trees to add to the biodiversity maintained at CTU. A Biodiversity Park will be developed at some identified place for the practical knowledge of students.

Meanwhile, the Admission Cell of the University has also launched a unique



programme to gift 5 saplings to admission seekers.

Chancellor, Charanjit Singh Channi,

motivated faculty and students to learn from the Philippines, that has just

enacted a law vide which high school and college students have to plant at least 10 trees, to graduate. "The law which could enable 175 million trees to be planted every year will enhance green cover that dropped by over 70% over the years", he said adding

that similar can be promoted at CTU. Sharing details, Dr Harsh Sadawarti, Vice Chancellor said, "For the good cause of environment and surroundings, planting of trees is very important. Trees combat global warming by absorbing carbon dioxide and producing oxygen, contributing to soil health, retaining water, and cooling overheated urban areas. The CTU, by involving its students, faculty and staff, will take its drive of tree plantation beyond the University campus also."

PEDA conducts 2 day training program on ECBC at CT Group

A two-day Capacity Building Training Program on Energy Conservation Building Code (ECBC)-2017 was organised by Punjab Energy Development Agency (PEDA) with the support of Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) at CT Group of Institutions, Maqsudan campus. For the effective implementation of ECBC, Punjab Energy Development Agency (PEDA) initiated the Capacity Building Training Programs which are being organized through ELA green buildings & infrastructure consultants at various locations in the state of Punjab for all Urban Local Bodies, Department of Architecture and Town Planning, Improvement Trusts, Builders, Developers etc. PEDA officer, in his address, emphasized on the smooth implementation of the ECBC and said

that it will ensure construction of energy efficient buildings, resulting reduction in electrical demand by 30-40% in the buildings. He further said that with about 1 billion m2 of commercial buildings yet to be built, there is huge potential of energy consumption. Navneet Arora, from ELA green buildings & infrastructure consultants talked about the compliance procedure of ECBC and mentioned that this code is mandatory for all the commercial buildings while approval of building plans.

Campus Director Dr. Jasdeep Kaur Dhami and Dr. Anurag Sharma, Dean Academics were present on the occasion and said that there is a dire need of energy conservation in buildings and
